MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Having been elected Chairman of the Parish Council earlier this year I feel I must thank the previous Chairman, Dougie Young and our hardworking Councillors who work as volunteers on behalf of the community. Thanks also go to KCC officers who have worked with us to provide some improvements on the A259.

The Parish Council continues to work on improving its efficiency and thanks to our officers, have been successful in obtaining a green energy grant from our District Council to install solar panels on the office, which are already reducing our energy costs. It is anticipated that we will soon be able to export our surplus energy back into the grid to further reduce our running costs.

I recently had the pleasure of welcoming our French Twinning families to Dymchuch for the weekend and would particularly like to thank those members of the community who hosted them on behalf of the Parish Council.

The Clerk and I attended a meeting hosted by the Kent Association of Local Councils with regard to the Government's proposals for reorganisation of County and District Councils into one unitary authority, but the impact on Parish Councils still remains unclear.

The Parish Council was asked to prepare a detailed scoping document with regard to the various proposals for Solar Farms and their impact on the surrounding area for the Government Inspectorate, who will ultimately make the decision as to the various planning applications. This was made after Councillors attended the public meetings that were organised by the applicants for the proposed Shepway Energy Park and the organisation, Hands Off Our Marsh who voiced their view that there will be a negative visual and environmental impact on the Romney Marsh.

The Dymchurch and District Twinning Association welcomed 10 French guests from Salbris in early September. back to our coach through the protesting on the streets (the French thought this addition to the day was rather exciting!) we had a delicious meal at the Martello pub on the way home.



Bathing Water Quality

The 2025 Bathing Water Quality results published for Dymchurch beach have shown a considerable improvement from Summer 2024, with many samples reaching the standard for "Excellent" water quality. Bathing water is sampled 20 times over the season and the results published online on the EA and SWIMFO Websites.



Local partner agencies have been working on identifying and fixing a number of issues that could impact our local water quality including identifying mis-connections in the network, investigating sewers with CCTV & Electroscan surveying, relining defective sewers both domestic and shared, improving the quality of effluent released from the local Water Treatment Works and sampling beach sediment to ensure it contains no harmful contaminants. This work has resulted in the improved sampling results for Summer 2025 with low levels of containments reported. The "no swim" advisory remains in place until the annual classification is updated to at least "Satisfactory" with the next annual results published by the Environment Agency in December.



Green Grant Award

The Parish Council have recently been awarded a Grant from F&HDC Green Grants for the installation of solar panels and battery storage at the council office on Orgarswick Avenue. The grant covers 80% of the installation costs and will allow the council to use more green energy and reduce it's utility bills saving around 1 ton of CO₂ and approximately £1,000 per year.

Dymchurch in Bloom 2025 Winners

Green-fingered residents of Dymchurch have been recognised for their excellent garden



displays in the "Dymchurch in Bloom" gardening competition. Despite the wind, rain and extended periods of heat experienced this year, the judges visited some spectacular outdoor spaces with certificates and prizes given to the winning and commended gardens.

The winning entry was awarded to Mr & Mrs Frampton who were presented with a £25 garden centre voucher.

The Parish Council have confirmed that the competition will return in July 2026

The Friends of Dymchurch Rec Update on behind the scenes progress on the New Pavillion

Since the planning permission for the new pavilion was submitted on behalf of FODR by Profile Architects in December 2023 a lot has happened. The original idea was for the new building to provide a flexible space both inside and out, with good wheelchair access, a kitchen area and servery, storage for sports equipment, toilets, a flexible hard standing area and added in along the way options for sports changing facilities. The plans were validated by F&HDC in January 2024, followed by extensive discussions with Sport England and The Kent Football Association on the use of the building. Concerns raised by RH&DR were addressed back in February 2024 and planning amendments were submitted during April 2024. An Ecology and bat survey was completed between July and September 2025 to ensure that demolishing the existing building does not impact any vital habitats. FODR are hopeful that full planning permission will now be approved in the next few weeks.

Once the plans are approved there's lots more work to do before a spade hits the ground working with structural engineers, cost consultants and building control. In the meantime the 4 images show how the new pavilion will look from the car park, the new entrance, the stunning overhanging roof looking out over the recreation ground and the view from the play area. With over £110k already in the bank the Friends are making good progress on raising the funds needed to

raising the funds needed to complete this community project.
